NOTE

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NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

- 1. On 21 December 1968, at its 1752nd plenary meeting, the General Assembly adopted resolution 2482 (XXIII) in which it established the level of the United Nations budget appropriations for the financial year 1969 at \$154,915,250 and approved an estimate of income other than income from staff assessment in the amount of \$9,235,240. Estimated income from staff assessment was approved in the amount of \$17,985,000.
- 2. The nature and purposes of the budget are set forth in two basic documents, the initial budget estimates submitted by the Secretary-General for the financial year 1969¹ and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions.² Subsequently, the Secretary-General submitted a series of revised estimates affecting the initial estimates, including those resulting from decisions taken by the Economic and Social Council at its forty-fourth and forty-fifth sessions, as well as from decisions taken by the General Assembly in the course of its twenty-third session. In each case, these estimates were the subject of a recommendation by the Advisory Committee. The discussion of the total budget estimates in the Fifth Committee and its recommendations thereon are reflected in its related report to the General Assembly.³
- 3. There follows a schedule indicating in detail the appropriations under each budget section. The three main General Assembly resolutions pertaining to the budget for the financial year 1969 are annexed to the present report.⁴

- (c) As to \$143,467,267, by assessment on Member States in accordance with General Assembly resolution 2291 (XXII) of 8 December 1967 on the scale of assessments for the financial years 1968, 1969 and 1970;
- 2. There shall be set off against the assessment on Member States, in accordance with the provisions of General Assembly resolution 973 (X) of 15 December 1955, their respective shares in the Tax Equalization Fund in a total amount of \$18,299,012, comprising:
 - (a) \$17,985,000, being the estimated staff assessment income for 1969;
- (b) \$181,712, being the excess of actual income over the approved estimated income from staff assessment for 1967;
 - (c) \$132,300,a being the increase in the revised income from staff assessment for 1968.

ANNEX II

Resolution 2483 (XXIII)

Unforeseen and extraordinary expenses for the financial year 1969

(Adopted by the General Assembly at its 1752nd plenary meeting, on 21 December 1968)

The General Assembly

- 1. Authorises the Secretary-General, with the prior concurrence of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions and subject to the Financial Regulations of the United Nations and the provisions of paragraph 3 below, to enter into commitments to meet unforeseen and extraordinary expenses in the financial year 1969, provided that the concurrence of the Advisory Committee shall not be necessary for:
- (a) Such commitments, not exceeding a total of \$US 2 million, as the Secretary-General certifies relate to the maintenance of peace and security;
- (b) Such commitments as the President of the International Court of Justice certifies relate to expenses occasioned by:
 - (i) The designation of *ad hoc* judges (Statute of the Court, Article 31), not exceeding a total of \$48,600;
 - (ii) The appointment of assessors (Statute, Article 30), or the calling of witnesses and the appointment of experts (Statute, Article 50), not exceeding a total of \$25,000;
 - (iii) The holding of sessions of the Court away from The Hague (Statute, Article 22), not exceeding a total of \$75,000;

^{3.} Direct expenses of the United Nations Postal Administration, services to visitors, catering and related services, and the sale of publications, shall be charged against the income derived from those activities.

- 2. Resolves that the Secretary-General shall report to the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions and to the General Assembly at its twenty-fourth session all commitments made under the provisions of the present resolution, together with the circumstances relating thereto, and shall submit supplementary estimates to the Assembly in respect of such commitments;
- 3. Decides that if, as a result of a decision of the Security Council, commitments relating to the maintenance of peace and security should arise in an estimated total exceeding \$10 million before the twenty-fourth session of the General Assembly, a special session of the Assembly shall be convened by the Secretary-General to consider the matter.

ANNEX III

Resolution 2484 (XXIII)

Working Capital Fund for the financial year 1969

(Adopted by the General Assembly at its 1752nd plenary meeting, on 21 December 1968)

The General Assembly

Resolves that:

- 1. The Working Capital Fund shall be established for the year ending 31 December 1969 in the amount of \$US 40 million;
- 2. Member States shall make advances to the Working Capital Fund in accordance with the scale adopted by the General Assembly for contributions of Members to the budget for the financial year 1969;
 - 3. There shall be set off against this allocation of advances:
- (a) Credits to Members resulting from transfers made in 1959 and 1960 from surplus account to the Working Capital Fund in a total amount of \$1,079,158;
- (b) Cash advances paid by Members to the Working Capital Fund for the financial year 1968 under General Assembly resolution 2365 (XXII) of 19 December 1967;
- 4. The Secretary-General is authorized to advance from the Working Capital Fund:
- (a) Such sums as may be necessary to finance budgetary appropriations pending the receipt of contributions; sums so advanced shall be reimbursed as soon as receipts from contributions are available for the purpose;
- (b) Such sums as may be necessary to finance commitments which may be duly authorized under the provisions of the resolutions adopted by the General Assembly, in particular resolution 2483 (XXIII) of 21 December 1968 relating to unforeseen and extraordinary expenses; the Secretary-General

- shall make provision in the budget estimates for reimbursing the Working Capital Fund;
- (c) Such sums as, together with net sums outstanding for the same purpose, do not exceed \$150,000, to continue the revolving fund to finance miscellaneous self-liquidating purchases and activities; advances in excess of the total of \$150,000 may be made with the prior concurrence of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions;
- (d) With the prior concurrence of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, such sums as may be required to finance payments of advance insurance premiums where the period of insurance extends beyond the end of the financial year in which payment is made; the Secretary-General shall make provision in the budget estimates of each year, during the life of the related policies, to cover the charges applicable to each such year;
- (e) Such sums as may be necessary to enable the Tax Equalization Fund to meet current commitments pending the accumulation of credits; such advances shall be repaid as soon as credits are available in the Tax Equalization Fund;
- 5. Should the provision in paragraph 1 above prove in-adequate to meet the purposes normally related to the Working Capital Fund, the Secretary-General is authorized to utilize, in 1969, cash from special funds and accounts in his custody, under the conditions approved in General Assembly resolution 1341 (XIII) of 13 December 1958, or the proceeds of loans authorized by the Assembly.

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
