**Annex to the letter dated 11 August 2009 from the Chargé d'affaires a.i. of Poland to the United Nations addressed to the Chairman of the Committee**

**Report to the Security Council Committee established in accordance with paragraph 12 of the Security Council resolution 1718 (2006) on steps undertaken by the Republic of Poland in order to implement the provisions of resolution 1874 of 12 June 2009**

According to paragraph 22 of resolution 1874 (2009), the Republic of Poland wishes to inform the Committee of the measures that have been undertaken at the national level in order to implement United Nations Security Council resolution 1874 (2009), adopted on 12 June 2009.

The relevant government agencies have been instructed to undertake all appropriate measures in order to implement the provisions of Security Council resolution 1874 (2009).

1. With the aim to meet requirements of paragraph 8 of resolution 1718 (2006), the Ministry of Economy of the Republic of Poland prohibits any trade with the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK), which would in any way contribute to the development of DPRK's nuclear weapons programme and the ballistic missile programme. In addition, the particular Departments of the Ministry of Economy dealing with bilateral international cooperation, nuclear energy, export control and defence matters have been informed about Security Council resolutions 1718 (2008) and 1874 (2009) and instructed to strictly comply with their provisions.
2. In order to implement paragraphs 9 and 10 of resolution 1874 (2009), the Ministry of Internal Affairs and Administration and the Ministry of Finance instructed the appropriate Customs Authorities and the Border Guard about the need to strictly control the cargoes to and from the DPRK suspected of containing goods listed in paragraphs 8 of resolution 1718 (2006) and 9 and 10 of resolution 1874 (2009). In case of detecting any attempts aimed at supplying, selling or transferring goods listed in the above-mentioned paragraphs the data concerning these transports will be collected by the appropriate authorities.
3. The Ministry of Infrastructure has also instructed the Marine Offices in Gdynia, Słupsk and Szczecin about the relevant provisions of resolution 1874 (2009), in particular the obligation to inspect, in accordance with the Polish and international law, and prohibit the servicing of DPRK's vessels believed to contain items the supply, sale, transfer or export of which is prohibited by paragraphs 8 (a), 8 (b) or 8 (c) of resolution 1718 (2006) or by paragraph 9 or 10 of resolution 1874 (2009).
4. With the aim to meet requirements of paragraphs 18, 19 and 20 of resolution 1874 (2009), the Ministry of Finance of the Republic of Poland has instructed the Presidents of banks, insurance companies and other lending institutions registered in Poland about the obligation to strictly adhere to the relevant provisions of resolution 1874 (2009).

5. The Ministry of Science and Higher Education of the Republic of Poland confirms that there are no DPRK citizens involved in specialized teaching or training, which could contribute to the DPRK's proliferation-sensitive nuclear activities and the development of nuclear-weapon delivery systems. The appropriate institutions involved in the enrolment of foreign students in Poland have been instructed to strictly abide by paragraph 28 of resolution 1874 (2009).

Moreover at the European Union level, the Republic of Poland participates in the drafting process of the final text of the Council Common Position amending Common Position 2006/795/CFSP concerning restrictive measures against the Democratic People's Republic of Korea which implements Security Council resolution 1874 (2009).

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
