
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Note verbale dated 11 July 2013 from the Permanent Mission of the Philippines to the United Nations addressed to the Chair of the Committee

Actions taken by the Government of the Philippines in compliance with Security Council resolutions 1718 (2006) and 1874 (2009)

- 1. The National Intelligence Coordinating Agency has updated its database on the new list of entities, individuals and goods subject to the measures imposed by the Security Council under paragraph 8 of its resolution 1718 (2006), as modified by its resolution 1874 (2009), requiring the States Members of the United Nations to freeze assets that are owned or controlled by designated entities, while preventing the entry or transit of designated individuals, among others, for monitoring and reference.
- 2. The Bureau of Immigration has placed on its blacklist the names of the individuals contained in annex I to Security Council resolution 2094 (2013).
- 3. The Bureau of Customs has issued a memorandum, dated 16 April 2013, directing all Deputy Commissioners, Service Directors, District Collectors and the Head of the Customs X-Ray Inspection Project to be on guard and/or to monitor and possibly blacklist entities/individuals and corresponding shipments to prevent their entry or transit though the Philippines. Moreover, all enforcement units of the Bureau of Customs are on heightened alert to closely monitor shipments coming from areas where United Nations targeted sanctions have been imposed.

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
