**Report of the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia on the
implementation of Security Council resolution [2371 \(2017\)](#)**

The Republic of Macedonia is convinced that full compliance with Security Council resolution [2371 \(2017\)](#) by all Member States will serve to reinforce peace and security in the world, by reaffirming the international community's conclusion that the proliferation of nuclear, chemical and biological weapons, as well as their means of delivery, constitutes a threat to international peace and security.

To effectively comply with the aforementioned resolution, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Macedonia has circulated the full text of resolution [2371 \(2017\)](#) to all relevant institutions in the Republic of Macedonia, including the Ministry of Justice, the Ministry of the Interior, the National Bank, the Ministry of the Economy, the Customs Administration and the Financial Intelligence Directorate along with a request for the full and effective implementation of its provisions in line with their competencies under national law.

The Republic of Macedonia would like to emphasize that there are no workers from the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, nor joint ventures or cooperative commercial entities with the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, in the Republic of Macedonia.

The Republic of Macedonia will continue to fully comply with the provisions and requirements provided for in the resolution.
