
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

Report of Madagascar on the implementation of Security Council resolutions 2270 (2016), 2321 (2016), 2356 (2017), 2371 (2017) and 2375 (2017)

Madagascar has always attached special importance to the principles set out in international legal instruments on nuclear disarmament and non-proliferation.

Madagascar encourages the peaceful use of atomic energy and strongly condemns any use of nuclear weapons. That commitment was renewed on 20 September 2017 when the Malagasy Government signed the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons, adopted on 7 July 2017.

The Malagasy Government cooperates with the United Nations in the implementation of Security Council resolutions on the Democratic People's Republic of Korea and complies with the Committee's decisions.

Madagascar uses all means at its disposal to share information on individuals and entities subject to United Nations sanctions, such as assets freezes, travel bans and other sanctions, to ensure their effective implementation.

In accordance with paragraphs 40 of resolution 2270 (2016) and 36 of resolution 2321 (2016), information on updates to the lists of individuals referred to in the resolutions has always been provided to the relevant authorities in order to facilitate the implementation of those resolutions at the national level.

In addition, the Malagasy Government will continue to work with Member States to facilitate the implementation of resolutions 2356 (2017), 2371 (2017) and 2375 (2017).

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
