Report of New Zealand on the implementation of Security Council resolution 2375 (2017)

New Zealand is committed to the effective implementation of the Security Council resolutions adopted under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations concerning sanctions imposed on the Democratic People's Republic of Korea.

In paragraph 19 of Security Council resolution 2375 (2017), the Council required all Member States to report to the Council within 90 days of the adoption of the resolution, and thereafter upon request by the Committee, on concrete measures they had taken in order to effectively implement the provisions of the resolution.

New Zealand wishes to inform the Committee that many provisions of the resolution are already implemented through New Zealand's current policy settings and the country's existing United Nations Sanctions (Democratic People's Republic of Korea) Regulations 2017. The remaining provisions of resolution 2375 (2017) will be implemented through the country's new United Nations Sanctions (Democratic People's Republic of Korea) Amendment Regulations 2017, which will enter into force in early January 2018 and will also serve to implement the remaining provisions of resolution 2371 (2017).
