Report of Ukraine on the implementation of Security Council resolution 2397 (2017)

Ukraine consistently fulfils its international obligations under the Charter of the United Nations to ensure that Security Council resolutions are fully implemented in national legislation.

On 14 November 2018, the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine adopted two orders:

- Order No. 855, entitled "On the proposal for the application of sectoral, special economic and other restrictive measures, in accordance with Security Council resolutions 2270 (2016), 2321 (2016), 2356 (2017), 2371 (2017), 2375 (2017) and 2397 (2017) concerning the Democratic People's Republic of Korea"
- Order No. 854, entitled "On the proposal for the application of personal, special economic and other restrictive measures, in accordance with Security Council resolutions 2270 (2016), 2321 (2016), 2356 (2017), 2371 (2017), 2375 (2017) and 2397 (2017) concerning the Democratic People's Republic of Korea"

Accordingly, all respective State agencies of Ukraine must adhere strictly to the implementation of all Security Council resolutions concerning the Democratic People's Republic of Korea.

Order No. 855 stipulates, inter alia, repatriation to the Democratic People's Republic of Korea of all nationals of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea earning income in Ukraine unless such repatriation is contrary to domestic and international law.

The register of the State Migration Service of Ukraine, an executive body responsible for the mandatory expulsion of foreign citizens, contains only four nationals of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea with immigrant status, who are lawfully present in the country.

In addition, since September 2017, no work permits have been issued to citizens of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea.
