The Permanent Mission of the People's Democratic Republic of Algeria to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Chair of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution [1718 \(2006\)](#), mandated to oversee the relevant sanctions measures relating to the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, and has the honour to submit the national report on measures undertaken by the Government of Algeria, for the years 2017, 2018 and 2019, to implement certain provisions of resolution [2375 \(2017\)](#) (see annex).

Report of Algeria on the implementation of Security Council resolution [2375 \(2017\)](#)

In the context of the implementation of Security Council resolution [2375 \(2017\)](#) regarding sanctions measures against the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Algeria has introduced several legal, judicial and operational measures.

2017

- With effect from 1 July 2017, Algeria decided that it would no longer grant work visas to North Korean nationals. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs has given instructions to all the Algerian diplomatic and consular posts abroad regarding the implementation of this decision.
- With effect from 31 December 2017, Algeria decided that it would no longer grant work permits to North Korean nationals or renew valid permits upon expiry. The Ministry of Labour, Employment and Social Security and the Ministry of the Interior have instructed the employment directorates of the *wilayahs* (governorates) to fully comply with this decision.
- Companies employing staff targeted by the provisions of the resolution have been advised to gradually replace them and to avoid employing such staff in future.

2018

- The information contained in the 2017 report regarding resolution [2375 \(2017\)](#) remains valid.

2019

- As at 10 March 2019, Algeria had repatriated all North Korean nationals with work permits ahead of the date set by the sanctions committee of 22 December 2019. All employment contracts of North Korean expatriates have expired and none have been renewed since 10 March 2019.
