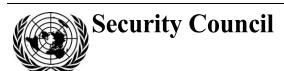

The Permanent Mission of the People's Democratic Republic of Algeria to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Chair of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1718 (2006), mandated to oversee the relevant sanctions measures relating to the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, and has the honour to submit the national report on measures undertaken by the Government of Algeria, for the years 2017 and 2018, to implement certain provisions of resolution 2397 (2017) (see annex).

Report of Algeria on the implementation of Security Council resolution 2397 (2017)

In the context of the implementation of Security Council resolution 2397 (2017) regarding sanctions measures against the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Algeria has introduced several legal, judicial and operational measures.

2017

- Since 13 November 2017, no North Korean companies or entities on the updated Security Council sanctions lists have been operating in Algeria.
- Since November 2017, these companies have not held any accounts with Algerian financial institutions.
- In terms of laws and regulations, an executive decree has been in effect in Algeria since 2015 that essentially governs the implementation of Security Council resolutions, in particular those relating to the freezing of assets.

2018

- In terms of laws and regulations, an executive decree has been in effect in Algeria since 2015 that essentially governs the implementation of Security Council resolutions, in particular those relating to the freezing of assets.
- Three orders of the Ministry of Finance Order No. 116 of 13 December 2017, Order No. 10 of 15 March 2018 and Order No. 42 of 6 September 2018 have been implemented for the freezing and/or seizure of funds of persons, groups and entities on the consolidated lists of the Security Council sanctions committee. These orders also apply as soon as the lists of persons, entities or other groups are updated by the committee.
- Regarding the case of Mensuade Overseas Project MOP/Group Algérie MGA, that entity has been struck off the Algerian company register since 8 January 2018 and has not carried out any activities in the country since that date. The assets held by this entity, which amount to practically nothing, have been frozen since 2017.

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
