Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 2140 (2014)

Note verbale dated 26 May 2015 from the Permanent Mission of Egypt to the United Nations addressed to the Chair of the Committee

The Permanent Mission of the Arab Republic of Egypt to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Chair of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 2140 (2014) with reference to the latter's note verbale dated 11 March 2015 regarding resolution 2204 (2015) (paras. 11 (assets freeze) and 15 (travel ban) of resolution 2140 (2014)).

In this connection, and with regard to the steps that have been taken by the Arab Republic of Egypt with a view to implementing effectively the paragraphs cited above, the Permanent Mission of the Arab Republic of Egypt to the United Nations has the honour to inform you of the following:

1. The Arab Republic of Egypt is committed to the implementation of the assets freeze and travel ban measures listed in paragraphs 11 and 15 of resolution 2140 (2014) and referred to in resolution 2204 (2015).

2. The provisions of the cited resolutions, in addition to resolution 2216 (2015), have been circulated to the governmental bodies and authorities concerned in order to take all the necessary measures towards the implementation of the above-mentioned resolutions.

3. The Government of the Arab Republic of Egypt indicates that no funds, assets or bank accounts in any of the Egyptian banks belong to any of the individuals on the sanctions list of the Committee. In addition, the data relating to those listed individuals have been circulated to the port authorities responsible for the implementation of the travel ban.

4. The Government of the Arab Republic of Egypt affirms its commitment to the implementation of the Security Council sanctions under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations. It will remain committed to the provisions of the Charter and will continue its efforts towards maintaining international peace and security and collective security.
