**Annex to the letter dated 14 March 2014 from the Permanent Representative of Belarus to the United Nations addressed to the Chair of the Committee**

The relevant bodies of the Government of the Republic of Belarus are putting into effect a set of measures to ensure implementation of Security Council resolution [2127 \(2013\)](#) on the Central African Republic.

In order to support international efforts to prevent the supply to the Central African Republic of arms and related materiel, authorized entities engaging in foreign commercial activity involving specific goods (work, services) have been informed of the provisions of resolution [2127 \(2013\)](#). Belarus has no military or technical cooperation with the Central African Republic.

In its military and technical cooperation with foreign States, Belarus holds unwaveringly to a strict and principled position of compliance with international legal norms for export control. Belarus takes all necessary domestic measures to prevent the direct or indirect supply or transfer of weapons and military equipment (work, services) to States under Security Council sanctions.

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
